A Message from our Principal

Dear Parents and Guardians,

We have had another amazing year in Scoil an Chroi Ro Naofa Iosa and our first full year free of Covid-19 restrictions since 2018/19. We really did make the most of this and so many of our favourite activities resumed.

The year began with the opening of two fantastic additions to our school environment - our new school playground (organised by Ms. Donohoe and Mr. Thynne) and our new occupational therapy room (designed by Ms. O'Gorman, organised by Ms. Morris and generously funded by Amazon). Mr. Doyle organised our soccer blitz in September and was assisted by Mr. Harraghy and Mr. Kestell. Elections for Student Council were held early in the year and the Student Council of 2022-2023, under the supervision of Mr. O'Callaghan, Ms. Fagan and Ms. J. Gillan, was extremely active throughout the year, including helping us to launch The Lunch Bag lunch delivery service in our school. Ms. Fagan and the Student Council also coordinated the fantastic Food Dudes programme in our school this year.

Also in September, auditions were held for our school musical, 'School of Rock'. Over 150 children showed up to audition and the teachers involved had the unenviable task of choosing a cast of just 70. Rehearsals continued throughout the winter and the hard work and commitment of the cast and production team really paid off when Scoil an Chroí Ró Naofa Iosa's production of 'School of Rock' lit up the stage and rocked the house in Draoícht for 5 sold out shows in February!

The first term also saw the return of the National Children's Choir programme in the school and 5th class children and teachers worked incredibly hard on a very challenging repertoire for over 7 months, culminating in an incredibly moving and entertaining performance in the National Basketball Arena in April. No less than 26 of our 5th class pupils then had the honour of being chosen to perform the repertoire again in a 'one night only' performance in the National Concert Hall in May.

Chess club was set up by Ms. Murray and Ms. Fagan during the winter months and many children learned new skills and had great fun playing chess together at lunchtimes, whilst Ms. Connell put the quiz teams through their paces. Ms. Dooley, Ms. O. Barry and Ms. J. Gillan organised our invaluable Anti-Bullying and Friendship Week initiatives in the school and these were wonderfully complemented by our safer internet activities coordinated by Mr. O'Callaghan and Ms. Higgins and we were so proud to win a Highly Commended Award in Webwise's Safer Internet Awards.

Ms. Kelly, Ms. S. Byrne, Mr. Mackessy, Mr. Mullally, Mr. Doyle, Mr. Harraghy and Mr. Madden organised our Gaelic football, soccer and athletics teams and we were delighted that a full programme of sport thankfully returned to our school this year. Ms. Mullany organised the return of the Book Fair to our school, which also meant that our incredible Parents' Association members could once again lend their time and talents to the school to facilitate this literary endeavour.

We celebrated First Holy Communion and Confirmation with our sacrament classes and some of our Coiscéim pupils and our school choir enhanced the ceremonies with their beautiful singing. The children were so well prepared by their teachers and SNAs and it was wonderful to see the church full to capacity and families heading off to celebrate their special day free from Covid-19 restrictions. School tours took place in term 3 and our much-loved Sports Days went ahead on two lovely dry and warm days in June, whilst Mr. Shelly and Ms. Higgins organised Active School Week. Many of our sixth class pupils were treated to an exciting day of BMX biking in St. Catherine's Park in Lucan and a group of children visited the Lidl farm in Newbridge, Co. Kildare.

As you can see, we have had an incredibly busy year in Scoil an Chroí Ró Naofa Íosa! As I look back on the year, I am immensely proud of our pupils who have overcome a challenging few years in their education, but have shown wonderful resilience throughout despite disruptions to their learning, much uncertainty and constantly changing rules and restrictions as a result of the pandemic. These children have dived back into school life with renewed energy and enthusiasm and this year has been testament to their spirit. Well done to all our pupils on a really great year's work!

I would also like to commend the incomparable staff of Scoil an Chroí Ró Naofa Íosa who have guided and supported our pupils through these uncertain times and who have also put so much hard work and commitment into their pupils' development this year. We are delighted with the government's recent announcement that primary school children will receive free school-books for the 2023-2024 academic year. Further to this an-

Unfortunately, the grant is not sufficient to cover all requisites

required for school and therefore the school requisites fee must be retained in school to provide for art and craft, photocopying, educational software licences etc.
